


It is important to have a home fire escape plan for your family. What if your first escape route is blocked by SMOKE or FLAMES? That's why having two ways out is such a key part of your plan. Use this checklist to help plan your family's escape:

Plan two or more escape routes from each room. The first is the door and the best way out. The second exit can be another door or window. Use it if the first exit is blocked or unsafe.

Pick a spot outside to be your family's safe meeting place. It could be a tree, a spot on the sidewalk, or anywhere outside that is safe.

Plan two or more escape routes out of your house and to your meeting place. If you live in an apartment, NEVER use the elevator.








Have a "kid-free zone" of at least three feet around stoves or anyplace hot foods or drinks are prepared.

Sprinklers reduce water usage for fighting a fire by more than 90% and help prevent polluted runoff.






